Evidence based approach in prosthetic dentistry - from diagnosis to the final reconstruction

Step by step

The Geneva – Reykjavik approach

In this one-day interactive session every step of the treatment of compromised partially edentulous patients will be elaborated in detail based on case discussion.

During the session, diagnostic, both traditional and digital, will be discussed.

Where are we now, where did we come from and where are we heading regarding treatment planning, esthetic aspects and smile design.

How should we select the appropriate reconstruction? When does it make sense to choose tooth-supported and when should we go for implant-supported reconstructions. How critical is the selection of components when restoring on implants? Does the implant geometry, the implant abutment connection and the abutment material matter?

Material selection guidelines for different reconstructions will be presented. What have we learned regarding new ceramic materials and where do we stand today towards older material like metal-ceramic.

The concept of minimally invasive dentistry will be presented and the influence of the tooth preparation and the cementation technique on the long-term outcome of different types of reconstructions will be discussed.

Every treatment aspect addressed in this session will be elaborated from the point of view of the prosthodontist, the periodontist and the dental technician. The three presenters will exchange their experience and ideas throughout the entire interactive session.
